Alberto Melloni (1959) studied history and church history in Bologna, Cornell and Fribourg and mostly at the Bologna institute for religious studies (now fscire.it) where he entered in 1982. He taught in Bologna and Roma 3: he is now full professor of History of Christianity at the University of Modena-Reggio and Chair Holder of the Unesco Chair on Religious Pluralism and Peace for his University and the University of Bologna. Since 2007 he is secretary of the the John XXIII Foundation for Religious Studies in Bologna. He is the director of the COGD program, the Hostoty of Ecumenism as he was for the history of Vatican II. He is a member of some scientific journals - «Cristianesimo nella storia», «Revue d'histoire ecclésiastique», «Schweizerischen Zeitschrift für Religions- und Kulturgeschichte», «Studia Historiæ Ecclesiasticæ», and member scientific board of several institutions. He received the Premio Capri per la Storia, Puskin Medal, and the Premio Nitti 2016. He has written more than 400 articles and several books on religious history. Among his last books Il conclave e papa Francesco, dir. da A. Melloni, Roma 2014; Amore senza fine, amore senza fini. Appunti di storia su chiese, matrimoni e famiglie, Bologna 2015; Il giubileo. Una storia, Roma-Bari 2015; Il concilio e la grazia, Milano 2016. He is columnist of «La Repubblica», and RaiNews.
